This is a chart showing excess diversions by the Orland Project. It is not complete as to the years and the actual amounts shown, the actual amounts are still subject to a claim by the Project that it was entitled on more from percent parcels based on its rights in a set of 4 loopholes on a still subject to a claim by the Project that it was entitled on more from the Antimer still to Gistument 312-2 can they justify more than 5 acre-feet per acre delivered because that's the maximum delivered volume awarded any upstream user. If OUWUA doesn't claim more than the 4.05 per acre the graph shows, then the amount allowed on the graph is the MAXIMUM they were allowed subject to reduction for certain types of less-thirsty crops.
